
A Brief History of Jesuit Education in Sri Lanka

- Their return to the island saw the establishment of three prominent schools managed by them:
 - St. Aloysius College Galle
 - St. Michael's College Batticaloa
 - St. Joseph's College Trincomalee

 majority of 60 members. Only the

 against it.



The Birth of Mount Calvary High School


 Mount Calvary High School was founded on the sacred grounds at the feet of Mount Calvary, Galle.



- 1. <u>Diversity</u> is a feature: different religious backgrounds
- 2. National curriculum in English medium: Grade 01 onwards
